Poetry Recitation



We begin our next literature book, My Side of the Mountain, by Jean Craighead George. In this classic tale of adventure and survival, Young Sam Gribley runs away from home (with his parents' blessing, of course) to live off the land in the woods of the Catskills Mountains in upstate New York. In the process, he discovers as much about himself as he does about surviving a harsh New York winter living in a hollowed-out hemlock tree.

Character Corner
